winter 2018-19 Social Skills Therapy Course Offerings

Each course incorporates a variety of lesson activities using visual cues, social stories, role-play activities, therapeutic social skill games, video-based curriculum, youth social skills literature, and many more specially created lessons and materials.

Preschool & Elementary

BRIDGING FRIENDSHIPS I

This course is for preschool to early elementary aged children. It features direct instruction of beginning social and play skills for social success and West Metro's Guided Play & Reinforcement time to practice play skills in a facilitated environment. Participants will have fun while learning skills and increasing basic communication and interaction skills. Participants will practice introducing oneself, greeting others, inviting others to play, joining others in play, sharing, listening, being a good sport, and developing motivation for approaching others to join in play.

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MANAGING ANXIETY AND STRESS II

"Managing Anxiety and Stress II" helps participants recognize stress and anxiety signals, varying degrees of stress, how to manage those feelings through relaxation techniques, how to advocate for themselves when they need a break, develop confidence and feelings of optimism and an understanding that stress and anxiety is experienced in a variety of ways.

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GETTING ALONG WITH FRIENDSHIP I

Placing greater focus on personal relationship development, this course adds a visual element to friendship development by introducing friendship "seeds" and friendship "be-gones" (behaviors that may "zap" potential friendships), providing a new way to look at friendship behaviors. Participants will develop their personal definitions of friend, recognize their personal strengths and deficits in the friendship making arena, and set a personal goal for improving their friendship making skills. Finally, the group will develop a repertoire of friendship activities and a band of vocabulary words to use to foster friendships.

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FITTING IN AT SCHOOL II

What are the skills teachers expect from students? This course addresses the skills that teachers expect from their students: social language and thinking, as well as effective communication and rule following. This course helps build the basics such as asking for help, listening, understanding, and following written and unwritten rules, and more.

This course is ideal for the child/teen in need of practice dealing with both friendly and non-friendly peers. Responsibilities of self and peers are explored as well as relationship maintenance, conversation skills, sarcasm, conflict and more.

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CONVERSATIONS IN THE COMMUNITY I

This course increases meaning and motivation for becoming effective communicators as well as increases and improves basic communication and interaction skills by developing and expanding competencies in all social language skills, verbal and nonverbal, expressive and receptive, literal and interpretive. It is based on activities and research from various social skill curricula including: Room 14 curriculum (Linguistics), Jed Baker Social Skills Training (APC), Social Star (Thinking Publications), and a handbook written by Debra Schipper which includes peer and adult greeting styles, introducing self and others, starting, maintaining and ending conversations, conversational manners, and a wide variety of "hidden language" and other nonverbal communication skills.

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STRAIGHTFORWARD STRATEGIES II

Designed for the young adult who has had some experience with life skills and wants to delve deeper into more mature topics. The focus of this course is to help motivate and empower students in day to day social decision making. Topics range from making a good impression, to bullying, to handling change, and to talking to the opposite sex and romantic relationships. This class will supply useful devices in social situations which will continue to guide and build straightforward strategies for the young adult.
